



PATH's mission is to end homelessness for individuals, families, and communities. We do this by building affordable housing and providing supportive services throughout California.

PATH SAN DIEGO'S STORY PATH began operating in San Diego in 2013 with the opening of Connections Housing, an integrated service and residential community in Downtown. We now provide interim and affordable housing and critical services countywide, including 24 programs and eight supportive housing sites. Additionally, PATH San Diego offers system navigation services at the Homelessness Response Center (HRC) and a wide variety of programs that help individuals and families across the county make it home.

KEY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Supportive Housing

PATH San Diego offers affordable housing with supportive services at eight sites. We provide wraparound services for vulnerable populations, including those with chronic health issues, mental health challenges, and disabilities. Our focus is on building independent living skills, offering intensive case management, connecting participants to community health and mental health services, and providing onsite life skills classes.

Interim Housing

Connections Housing offers 150 interim housing beds where individuals can find respite from the streets while they work towards securing permanent housing and achieving self-sufficiency. We also partner with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to ensure unsheltered Veterans have a safe place to stay while developing their housing plans.

Rapid Re-Housing (RRH)

Our RRH team helps individuals quickly exit homelessness and secure their own homes through housing placement assistance, security deposits, short-term rental assistance, and stabilizing case management. We also operate the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program, which offers RRH services to Veterans experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless.

Housing Search & Navigation

Housing specialists collaborate closely with participants to identify their needs and overcome barriers, quickly connecting them to sustainable housing opportunities. Our housing specialist team manages a robust database of more than 400 property owners and community partners, offering tenant education and mediation support to promote long-term housing stability.

Coordinated Street Outreach

Outreach staff engage and build trusting relationships with unsheltered individuals to help enroll them into stabilizing services. Our staff conduct assessments, identify needs and challenges, and make referrals to services that help people move off the street and into housing.

Multidisciplinary Outreach Team (MDT)

These specialized teams focus on supporting individuals who are unsheltered and frequently cycle in and out of San Diego's hospitals and justice system. MDT applies a clinical approach to street outreach by incorporating trained social workers, a street medicine team, and access to a full-service medical and behavioral health center, operated by our partner organization, Father Joe's Villages.

Community Care Coordination (C3)

Funded by the County of San Diego, C3 supports justice-involved individuals at risk of homelessness upon release. We serve adults and transitional-aged youth, including Veterans and those facing mental health or medical challenges. Our program provides up to one year of wraparound services, including emergency housing assistance, case management, healthcare coordination, food support, and transportation to secure stable housing and prevent recidivism.

CalAIM

The CalAIM program serves Medi-Cal beneficiaries experiencing homelessness who have complex physical, behavioral, or developmental health needs. Our focus is on enhancing provider connections, engaging healthcare providers, and strengthening community support to reduce the utilization of inpatient and emergency department services.

Employment Services

Our Employment Services program supports Veterans and justice-impacted C3 participants in finding and maintaining jobs through training, resources, case management, and an alumni network. We assist with certifications, necessary attire, and transit, while our specialists collaborate with employers for quick job placements.

HUD-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) The HUD-VASH program, in partnership with the VA, offers long-term case management and housing vouchers to unhoused Veterans in San Diego County, facilitating permanent housing through healthcare access, substance use counseling, and mental health support.



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
